News about returning to school. You will have heard on the news yesterday that the Government plans to issue a statement next week about how schools will be opened up in the future. We have **no date yet** so don't get too excited! Although I know you would really like to know times and dates, and that that would be a

great help to you, I am afraid this information is not yet available. What we do know is that it is very, very unlikely that all the children will be coming back to school on the same day when we are allowed to open so we will all have to adjust to a different sort of school for a period when we can re-open.

I am very pleased that we can plan for our reopening, and have looked at possible ways in which we can have children back, so we are well prepared as soon as we get the official guidance. Of course the top priority in that planning is to minimise risk to the lowest possible level for your child/children and the staff. I will keep you informed and there should be more definite information for us all next week.

In the meantime, I hope that will help encourage you that you won't be home schooling forever! Equally if you have loved every minute of this time home schooling with your child/children do prepare yourself for the news that there will be a plan for a return to school.

VE Day Celebrations We have tried to match 'in and out of school' celebrations so children can share their experiences. However, in school we will celebrate on May 7th as school is shut for everyone on May 8th.

Each year group learning pack will have activities linked to VE Day next week for your children to enjoy preparing but also to learn about why the day is held.
